The theme will be "**Winter Holiday Show**". Paintings will be judged in categories, with awards as usual. You may enter any subject you want, but we will give an additional award for Best of Theme. Miniatures will be an extra category. You may enter two pieces plus one miniature piece. **Important:** Miniature must not be any larger than 108 square inches. Example: 108" equals 9x12 being the **Outside of Frame**. Therefore, the artwork will be smaller depending on the frame width. If your width times the length of outside of frame is 108" or less, that qualifies. This should be an exciting show this time of year. Be sure to mark your calendar for the awards Reception November 10th.

JEFF HORN

Jeff Horn earned his Masters of Arts degree from California State University in 1979 and is currently a professor of drawing and painting at Irvine Valley College in Irvine, California.

As a draftsman, Horn became known for his portrait series of the Homeless, which became a feature article for American Artist Magazine.



In 2000, he received top honor in the quick draw category at the LPAPA invitational competition and best on canvas on board in the Carmel Art Festival, and

several honorable mention awards. He received third place in the landscape category of the California Art Club's 89th Annual Gold Medal Exhibition. He has twice won the Oil Painters of America Award of Excellence, in 2001 and 2004.



His paintings are part of the permanent collections of the Laguna Beach Festival of Arts, the Laguna Canyon

Foundation, and the Pacific Club in Newport Beach.

Horn is an artist member of the California Art Club and a signature member of the Laguna Plein Air Painters Association.
