FRANCES VIOLA HANSEN

1913 - 2004

We mourn the passing of Fran Hansen, Honored Member, Friend, and Beloved Mentor. Fran was a Life Member, our first Member of the Year (1970-71), and our third President (1956-57). She also served as President in 1960-61.

Fran was very active in the Association. In addition to President, she served as Treasurer, Auditor, Historian, Parliamentarian, and Craft Workshop Chairman. As an Artist and Craftsman, she was both gifted and versatile. Her creations included beautiful silver jewelry, copper tooling (trays and plaques), mosaic tiles, beadwork, petit point, and needlework. Fran was heavily involved in the formation and development of the Association. She worked closely with the Founder, Lilian Finlay, and with the seven Charter Members, and was a key player in the legal and technical aspects of establishing the Association as a smooth-running non-profit corporation.

For the next 40 years, Fran's instruction, guidance, and advice kept the Association on its ever-upward path to greatness, until now, we say, with respect and affection: You made us what we are today, Fran. Thank You!
